







- b) Applicants must be in the junior year of undergraduate study at a U.S undergraduate institution
- c) Have a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher on a 4.0 scale at the time of application

*Women, members of minority groups historically underrepresented in the Foreign Service, and students with financial aid need are encouraged to apply
